

ASSESSMENT METHOD	ASSESSMENT CRITERIA
Lab assignments (practical outcome)	<p>Assessment criteria for lab assignments. Each student is given two individual assignments. One of them is related with radiolocation systems and another with navigation systems.</p> <p>Lab work is given a passing grade if:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - the assignment is done correctly - the student is able to answer any additional questions <p>The results of the lab assignments are presented orally. They do not need to be presented in writing. The lab assignments must have a passing grade in order for the student to be able to take the exam.</p>
Written tests (all outcomes)	<p>Assessment criteria for written tests. Each student must do two written tests concerning materials previously handled in the lectures. The tests must have a passing grade in order for the student to be allowed to take the exam. The results of the tests are not necessary to be presented orally.</p> <p>Tests below score of 51 points to be redone.</p> <p>The grades given for the test are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> „0“ - less than 51 points „1“ - 51-60 points „2“ - 61-70 points „3“ - 71-80 points „4“ - 81-90 points „5“ - 91 and more points
Research paper (all outcomes)	<p>Assessment criteria for research paper Each student is given an individual assignment. Student can make a choice, write the paper about radiolocation technologies or navigation and positioning technologies.</p> <p>The research papers are presented orally during seminars. The paper must be presented in order to be able to take the exam.</p> <p>The research paper gets a passing grade if:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - the topic is covered fully and thoroughly - the student is able to answer questions concerning the topic (the professor as well as attendant of the seminar may ask questions) - the student attends all the seminars <p>If the paper initially doesn't get a passing grade it is possible to get a passing grade if it is submitted in writing as well as orally defended.</p>

<p>Written exam (all outcomes)</p>	<p><i>Assessment criteria for written exam.</i></p> <p><i>The exam is written. Each student is given an individual set of questions. The set contains 10 questions concerning different topics. Each question gives a a maximum of 10 points.</i></p> <p><i>It is possible to earn maximum 100 points for the exam. After the initial grades are given the students have a right to continue exam orally, to explain his or her solutions and answers aswell as answer any additional questions the professor might have. The final grade after the additional oral exam can be higher aswell as lower than the initial grade for the written exam.</i></p> <p><i>The grades given for the exam are as follows:</i></p> <p><i>„0“ - less than 51 points</i></p> <p><i>„1“ - 51-60 points</i></p> <p><i>„2“ - 61-70 points</i></p> <p><i>„3“ - 71-80 points</i></p>
